

Legion of Honor Club Guidelines

Definition:

The Legion of Honor is an award presented by the Imperial Potentate, to Nobles who have demonstrated, by action, their dedication to the principles and concepts of Prince Hall Shrinedom, and who have contributed **SIGNIFICANTLY** to the **GROWTH** of Shrinedom in their local Temples.

This program was established by the Imperial Council (1988) to bestow special thanks to outstanding Nobles who have performed beyond the call of duty in the past and present, and who will continue to promote the best interests of Shrinedom in the future.

Guidelines:

- A. The candidate must have made **SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS** to Shrinedom in his local Temple. He must have attended three (3) Imperial Sessions as documented in the Records Office.
- B. The recommendation and the determination for eligibility will be vested in the local Temple along with any other that the Imperial Potentate may dictate.
- C. A nominating committee, appointed by the Illustrious Potentate, will report their recommendations to the local Temple along with nominations from the floor for final determination at their regular meeting.
- D. The Temple recommendation is to be forwarded to the Imperial Potentate with the following:
 - i. A Legion of Honor application form (these are acquired from the Imperial Records Office) with the Temple Seal signed by the Illustrious Potentate and attested to by the Illustrious Recorder
 - ii. A resume of the candidate relating their contributions to Shrinedom and their community.
 - iii. A fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) for each candidate must accompany the recommendation. This fee is refundable if the Imperial Potentate does not approve the candidate.
- E. Each Temple may recommend at least three (3) candidates each year in accordance with guidelines as stated above. Waivers may be requested through the Imperial Director for submission to the Imperial Potentate.
- F. The candidate **MUST ATTEND** the Imperial Session at which the award is to be presented.
